BIRD HIDE MEETING

n the evening of 14th June nine interested members met at the Edithvale Seaford Education Centre to discuss how the interior of the hide should look, what to include, and its operating hours.

The hide has been substantially raised off the ground so that there is a higher roof on the lower level; on this level, the former display area in the middle will not be reinstated, and part of an interior wall will be removed to provide better wheel chair access. Various displays will be in this area together with some activities for children.

There will be a donation honour board.

Options will be explored for replacing the large upper window with one that can be more easily cleaned, and, for slightly enlarging the downstairs

windows for better photo opportunities.

The possibility of getting a grant for a solar panel will be looked into.

FESWI would like to maintain its volunteers at both the Edithvale Seaford Education Centre (2nd and 4th Sunday each month) and at the hide. Opening hours are very dependent on the number of volunteers - it is hoped to open the hide every Sunday to start with (and then extend to include Saturdays in the future).

This requires four people every Sunday at the hide, and then twice a month another four at the Education Centre. It was decided to approach various agencies (eg relevant student groups; bird watching organisations; council volunteer websites, community centres) as well as tapping into the local retired demographic (eg Richfield Village, Lifestyle Villages etc) for extra volunteers. Training sessions will be provided for all volunteers. Ideally we would like to see more of our own existing members involved.



There will be an official opening of the hide on Wednesday 3rd August 11:00am by Sean Dooley (see page 2) with guests from local community groups, councillors, politicians, Melbourne Water and

others. The first public opening day will be the following Sunday (7th August.) and all are welcome.

A working bee date for setting up the interior of the hide has been made for Sunday 24th July between the hours of 10:00am and 1:00pm. If you can help, come any time between these hours. 
Committee – No one really seems to want to be on it, but come on – **you** can! Meets once a month – makes a few decisions and acts on them. Too easy!

MW Liveability Team Meeting

Melbourne Water Liveability Program provided \$20,000 towards the bird hide restoration, which enabled FESWI to match this amount with the Stronger Communities Program grant.

FESWI committee members Philippa Bailey and Robin Clarey were pleased to meet Dan Green, Hannah Pexton and Virginia Harris from the Liveability Team, on Monday 27th June at the bird hide to show them the restoration work in progress, and explain the background of the Friends group and current activity schedule.

WORKING BEES

The Chelsea Heights Project Rex Chugg

The Chelsea Heights Project which began in October 2010 has come on really well. Around 2000 plants were purchased from Carrum Indigenous Nursery and over the next few years these were planted out. We had many problems with weed infestations which tended to over-power the small plants. With a couple of whipper-snippings and a little spraying the plantlings won out. Hurray!

Now after nearly 6 years we have a wonderful forest of native trees to the delight of the lcals, many of whom use the path and the area in general in their daily walks. Opposite are a couple of photos showing before and after. The first is October 2010 (before) and the second is June 2016 (after).



Seaford Working Bee

Seaford Working Bees take place on the first Sunday of the month. Volunteers are currently working in the south east corner of the wetlands buffer zone, where under storey plants are being put in. In the May and June plantings more than 200 were put in and a little weeding done to boot. Extra help is always welcome.

Several hours later at about 7:30pm had a phone call from AWARE. A lovely lady, Nicky, was on her way out to pick it up! I was so happy! I went out to meet her on the wetland; it was very dark but she was quick and efficient and had that bird bundled up and into a carrying box before it could say Jack Robinson.

The next day I received an SMS to say that a vet associated with the group had removed a hook and some fishing line

entanglement from its wing and it is now recuperating at Warrawee Wildlife Shelter.

What great work these people do!
